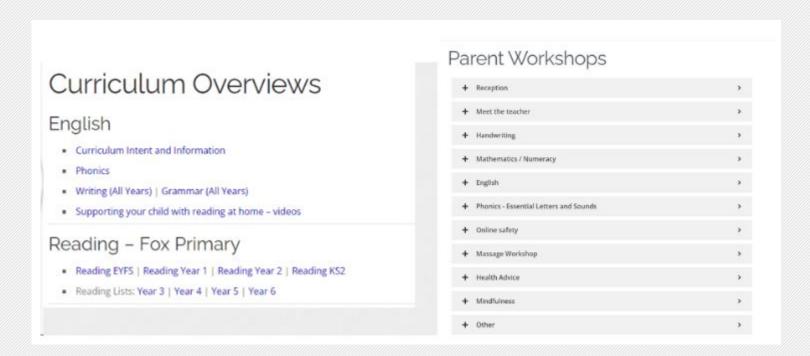
General clothing expectations + PE Kit

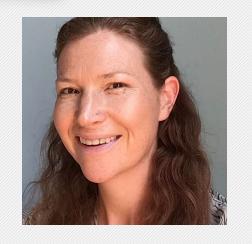

She will offer support for both children, staff and families.



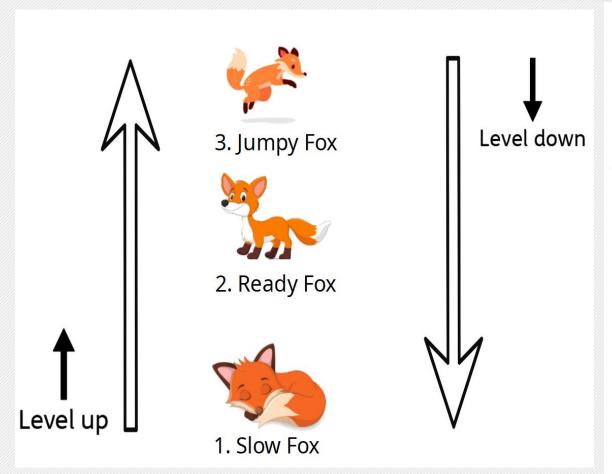


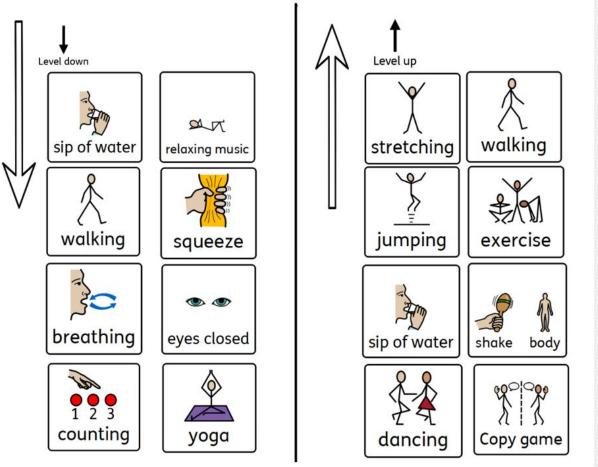
